

Potluck and Forum May 25. Friends are invited to a new Poor Peoples Campaign (PPC) forum on Friday, May 25, at Friendship Friends Meeting, located at 1103 New Garden Rd, Greensboro, NC 27410. A pot luck dinner at 6pm will be followed by a presentation and discussion with the Rev. Wesley Morris, new pastor of Faith Community Church. Faith Community Church is a leader in local organizing for the PPC movement. The new PPC is a national movement managed on the state level so that different states can focus on their issues and successful strategies. PPC has noted that conditions appear to have worsened since the initial campaign 50 years ago. The goal is to change the moral agenda across the nation to focus on the issues of impacted people - which include: poverty, racism, militarism, and ecological disasters. The hope is to create a new moral dialogue.

Cemetery Tour - Max Carter will lead a 10am tour of the New Garden cemetery on May 28. Highlights of the tour will include graves from the Revolutionary War, Civil War, and 20th century conflicts but also graves of those whose battles were in the area of peace and justice work. Comfortable shoes, water, sunscreen, and tolerance for an old Quaker Studies professor's rambling stories are recommended. The tour is free and open to all who are interested -- or who, like the tour leader, have no social life!
