

American Friends Service Committee is asking for our help: On Wednesday, June 13 at 6:30pm, there will be an important action to help stop the 287g program from returning to Alamance County. 287(g) is a federal collaboration between ICE and local law enforcement departments. It is the program that, for years, led to our neighbor Alamance County being considered the most dangerous county in the state for Latino residents. That is the program that got Alamance County investigated by the Department of Justice for racial profiling and caused Pres. Obama to cancel the 287g program in Alamance. Now with Trump in office, the sheriff wants to bring it back. We have an opportunity to stop it. The return of 287g would mean more people than ever needing Sanctuary and/or getting immediately deported without enough time to seek Sanctuary.

Can you attend? We need to get as many people there as possible. This is a nationwide campaign, and we have an opportunity to participate right here in NC. It is a little late notice, but we still have just over 1 week to organize. It would be great to have a big group of Quakers there!
